Sunday, Nov. 13 - Returned Filled & Packed Boxes 2 Your Boxes are in the foyer. Operation Christmas Child Brochures are on the white podium behind the boxes. The brochure provides information on how to pack your shoe box, including gift suggestions. Gift Suggestions: Always include soap (in a Ziploc bag), washcloth, toothbrush (s), toothpaste and a comb or a brush. Toys: Beanie Babies (we heard you can get these at Morganton trade lot for 50 cents), yo-yo's, balls, small cars, other stuffed animals, dolls, kazoos, harmonicas, jump rope, Slinky, Etch-a-Sketch, or toys that light up or make noise. School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculator, coloring and picture books.

Other: hard candy (tootsie rolls are OK, but no other form of chocolate), lollipops, mints, gum (all candy in Ziploc bag), T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights. If you include anything that requires batteries, add extras. We have been told that Mighty Dollar (in Forest City & Hendersonville) and Dollar Tree are good places to shop for these items. Don't forget: 1. Include \$7 donation for each shoe box to help with shipping and other costs. You can pay online (see website, www.samaritanspurse.org or brochure for details) or by check payable to Samaritan's Purse. If you are doing more than one box. write one check and place it in any one of your boxes. 2. Use a rubber band to secure the box.
