Pastor's Ponderings

"When I was growing up, my dad taught my brother and me to ski. I learned to love it. I remember the first time Alan and I skied for most of the day by ourselves. At the end of the day we clicked off our skis, and dad asked us a peculiar question: "Did you fall today?" "What?"

The question sounded pessimistic. That's not the normal first question you ask someone coming off a day on the slopes. Dad said it again: "Did you fall today?"

"No, I don't think I did," I responded somewhat proudly.

"Then you didn't try something new today, did you?"

His response startled me. What do you mean? I stayed up the entire day without falling! Dad went on to explain that if we didn't fall then we probably weren't in a position to try something new, something daring, something that scared you a little bit—something that involved risk on the mountain. And thus, we probably didn't have an opportunity to become a better skier."



The Voice
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Like J.R., we like to play it safe. We want to do those activities with which we feel comfortable and safe. God asks us to step out of our comfort zones every once in a while and do something new, something we haven't done before. Why? He does it for at least a couple of reasons. One, He wants us to learn to trust Him. He wants our faith to grow. God wants us to be willing to be totally dependent on Him. Another reason, He wants us to do a better job of serving Him. The more we risk, the better we become at serving God with the gifts He has given us. Sometimes we are able to use gifts we didn't even know we had until we stepped out in faith and used them.

God asked Moses to step out of his comfort zone. Moses had all kinds of excuses not to do what God asked him to do, but in the end, Moses learned to totally depend on God. Because he trusted God, Moses became better and better at what God called him to do.

I know in my own life the longer I serve Him, follow Him out of my comfort zones, and step into activities which God calls me to do, the better I get at completing – and even excelling – at those tasks. I learn day by day to trust Him more because He has never let me down. I know by faith He will never let me down. I know if I obey God in doing something I have never done before, He will empower me to accomplish what He calls me to do.

There is a prayer in the Bible known as the prayer of Jabez. He prays for God to expand his borders. He is asking God to help him go beyond his comfort zone and serve God in ways he has never served Him before. Jabez wanted to be better in his service and more secure in his trust in the God who created him. Are you willing to pray that prayer? Are you willing to do something that scares you a little bit? Are you willing to try something new for God? If you do, I believe you will find Jesus will be right there with you to empower you, protect you, and see you through. You will be blessed if you take risks for Jesus.
