Pastor's Ponderings

I happen to have a lot of stuff I have collected over the years. I rent storage space from Phil and Liz, and from time to time I go and look at and inventory my stuff. Last Tuesday, I went to the storage unit where my stuff is which is right beside I-40. Something seemed very strange to me as I was looking around. There was no traffic in the eastbound side of I-40. I began to wonder if there was a huge accident that completely blocked that side of the interstate. After a time, there was still no traffic and my curiosity began to build. Every now and then I would hear voices coming over a loud speaker, but still no traffic. About twenty minutes later a police motorcycle came down the road with the police lights on. A few minutes later another came by and still no traffic. If finally dawned on me I had heard something about President Obama coming to our area, but I wasn't sure when. When the disciples asked Jesus when this would take place, Jesus told them to watch for the signs. It is our responsibility as Christians to spread the news. We can't make others listen, understand, and accept; but we are still to tell of the salvation Jesus has to offer those who will believe.
