Well, it's that time of year again. Fall has arrived, but it's still warm outside. Our Facebook feeds are filling with various memes and complaints about it being "Fall" but that the temperatures don't seem to be falling. Many will lament about living in the South and how we don't have fall anymore, forgetting that it's never been unusual to see an 80+ degree day in mid-October. Others will bemoan the crisis of made-man global warning, using yet another Indian summer to push their atheistic agenda. (I mean seriously, if this were all that unusual would we have a term to describe that pre-dates my grandmother!) During all this hoopla, I try to stay content with the weather, knowing that the weather will change soon enough; but more importantly, knowing I know The One in charge of it all.

A couple years ago, I was doing a sermon series on the book of Genesis and a certain phrase was brought to my attention. Something that I had always overlooked, and never gave much consideration. Look at what Genesis 1:14 says, "Then God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night. They will serve as signs for seasons and for days and years." See, when God placed the sun, moon, and the stars in the sky it was not just to provide light. It was intended for us to be able to keep a calendar, so that we might celebrate the different festivals that God would later appoint. But it is more than just these things.

The creation story is intended primarily to teach us about the sovereignty of God. Many ancient cultures, such as the Egyptians, worshipped the sun, moon, and stars. But Genesis tells us that Yahweh is not only the one that placed them in the sky, He created them. And by doing so He sets Himself over the seasons and festivals, many of which revolved around the harvest time.

This is another lesson in sovereignty because other cultures that would plague the Israelites in the Promised Land worshipped "gods" that were over the harvest; Ba-al being just one example. So the creation story begins the Israelite story establishing Yahweh over all creation, not just one facet of it; and not only that, He is over all of the tribal "gods" that all the pagan nations call upon.

God, being God, saw not only the trials the Israelites would face, but also the temptations that future believers would face as well. Cultures that saw consistent change in their seasons often feared fall and winter. Flowers died, trees went dormant, and animals retreated into hibernation. Surely this was a time that "god" was being conquered or at the very least taking a break. The Norse referred to winter as Odin-sleep, because it was during this time that their chief god Odin would go into hibernation himself so that he might be rejuvenated. When he awoke, the season of Spring began. But we worship a God who never sleeps, who isn't conquered by death or Fall or Winter; because at the very beginning of time He set the whole process in motion, and He continually monitors it

Yes, Fall is here. And yes, it's still hot out. But you know what, that's okay. And I've come to realize that while Autumn may still be my favorite season, I love all the seasons and all the different joys they bring. And I'm glad that I live in a region that, relatively, gets to enjoy them all. But most of all I love them because they are a quiet, gentle reminder that God is in charge of everything including the seasons.
